## What the judges say – James Caan, CEO, Hamilton Bradshaw

Launched in 2010, the Asian Awards in partnership with Lebara were created to celebrate the highest calibre of individuals from the South Asian community across all spheres of activity. The Asian Awards honour pioneering individuals who are an inspiration to people all over the world.

Earlier this year James Caan, CEO, Hamilton Bradshaw, joined a panel of 20 accomplished judges to choose a winner in categories including the Lloyds Banking Group Business Leader of the Year, the Lloyds Banking Group Philanthropist of the Year, and the PwC Entrepreneur of the Year Award categories.

As the Asian Awards 2011 are now fully underway, Mr Caan has agreed to share some of his thoughts on why the Awards are so important, on a national and global scale, and which qualities in business and in life make a true winner.

HS: In your opinion, what qualities particular to successful Asian business leaders make them world class? Or, how would you characterise Asian entrepreneurialism and what can the world's most enterprising people learn from them?

JC: Determination and Dedication. If you look at the Forbes top 10 billionaires, two of them are Asian. Businessmen such as Lakshmi Mittal and Mukesh Umbani, have got where they are today because of their entrepreneurial spirit. It's that drive and focus that is so common amongst Asian business leaders. This trait is reinforced by the fact that 67% of UK-based Asian businesses are family-owned, so Asian children are exposed to vital entrepreneurial activity from an early age.

HS: Who do you look up to / who have inspired you the most in your career?

JC: My father has been my main inspiration in life. I believe that because I watched my father start his own business, make his own decisions and follow his own dreams, it was a lifestyle I decided I wanted for myself. From my perspective, it seemed the only way forward. My father gave me the most valuable advice, especially when it comes to business rela-Firstly, he always tionships. taught me to observe the masses and do the opposite, and I have followed this mantra in my own career. Secondly, he said I should

always make sure that when putting a deal together, that I should ensure both parties were happy with the outcome. It have always done business on the basis that to be successful long term, a win-win strategy is essential.

**HS:** With so many inspirational people involved in the Asian Awards, who were you the most star-struck by last year, and why?

JC: Sachin Tandulkar. Regardless of being Asian or Indian.
